

The History Corner First Library in GCS - VIA Clubhouse

Our Education/Library Committee oversees our October program, and it seems fitting to remind everyone of the impact our club made in these two categories so many years ago. Our VIA was responsible for starting the first library in Green Cove Springs in 1888. The Bordens of the Borden Milk Family gave us the cottage that same year and a Mr. J.J. Merritt gave the clubwomen a single book to start the library. This single book prompted visitors as well as members to donate books to the club, and this grew into the first library in our small town. The ladies of the VIA maintained the library right here in our clubhouse until December of 1961, when it became a part of the Clay County library system.

In 1897, Mrs. E.G.G. Munsell was installed as president (her picture is to the right of our stage). During her third year as president, the ladies began and maintained a kindergarten in the public-school building. The VIA assumed the expenses and paid a qualified teacher to instruct the children from 1900-1904. So our very own VIA was responsible for starting the first kindergarten and the first library in Green Cove Springs. Our ladies have actively supported the library as well as education since that beginning many years ago.


