Who is The Litter Bug?

Did you know that there is law against littering? Florida Statute 403.413 states any amount less than 15 pounds is guilty of a misdemeanor and the fine is \$100.



I thought about it when driving over the Buckman Bridge often and noticing all the debris that sits against the outside walls. Then, there is all the debris in the medians and along the sides of the street, sometimes caused by the garbage collectors!

Did you know that litter can cause animals in nature to get sick and die? Many years ago there was often a group of prisoners picking up debris but I don't think they do that now. So who does clean up after these litter bugs? My research shows that it is done by the city and state workers. I saw where the City of Tampa gathered over 200 TONS of litter in 2022!

I remember from long ago a tv ad showing an Indian chief standing among the street litter with tears running down his face. Do we no longer care? Are you thinking what can we do? Well we can start small, by putting our car trash in a bag or container and disposing of it properly; not rolling down the window and "letting it fly!"; teaching those around us to be considerate of the next generation's use of this planet, and helping pick up when we can.

Healthy Tidbits with Health & Wellness

From the American Heart Association Stress and Insomnia Linked To Irregular Heart Rhythms After Menopause



About 1 in 4 women may develop irregular heart rhythms after menopause, with stressful life events and poor sleep being leading factors, finds a new study in the Journal of the American Heart Association.

A study of more than 83,000 questionnaires by women ages 50-79 found more than 25% developed irregular heart rhythms, known as atrial fibrillation, which may increase their risk for stroke and heart failure. Stressful life events and insomnia were strongly linked to the development of atrial fibrillation, highlighting the need for mental well-being evaluations to be included with physical health examinations.

History Corner

So about that clock

This work of art was made by clockmaker, Williams Cummins (1786 – 1834).

The clock's first owner, Nickolas Camball, was a member of the Boston Tea Party! Born December 24, 1732 on the island of Malta, Camball came to this country in 1788. He founded a society for the benefit of children and widows of seamen.

Upon his death in 1828, Camball bequeathed the clock to Captain William Carr (1764 – 1845). When Captain Carr passed, the clock was bequeathed to his daughter, Rebecca Ingraham.

Rebecca is the link to how the clock comes to Green Cove Springs. Rebecca was the wife of Captain Mason Ingraham and a member of the VIA. She left the clock to her daughter, Rebecca C. Burrows who lived in GCS. The clock remained in the Carr Mansion in Warren Rhode Island from 1776 to 1889, when Mrs. Burrows brought it to her home in GCS.

Mrs. Burrows presented the clock to the VIA in March 1899 in memory of her mother, Rebecca Ingraham, who was a former VIA member.



The gentleman in the photo above is Mr. Jerry Casale. Jerry lives in the 3 story home next to the Post Office, behind the VIA. The clock belonged to the original owner of his home.

Isn't it amazing how we can connect to the history of our GCS community?

So about that clock, it's awesome for sure. A very tangible VIA treasure and link to our past!
