### Healthy Tidbits with Health & Wellness

From the American Heart Association Stress and Insomnia Linked to Irregular Heart Rhythms After Menopause

About 1 in 4 women may develop irregular heart rhythms after menopause, with stressful life events and poor sleep being leading factors, finds a new study in the Journal of the American Heart Association.

A study of more than 83,000 questionnaires by women ages 50-79 found more than 25% developed irregular heart rhythms, known as atrial fibrillation, which may increase their risk for stroke and heart failure.

Stressful life events and insomnia were strongly linked to the development of atrial fibrillation, highlighting the need for mental well-being evaluations to be included with physical health examinations.

#### History

#### VIA Clubhouse Tour

The following excerpt is from the presentation by VIA member, Janey Fox, as shared with tour attendees during the recent inaugural Historic Houses Tour of GCS.

February 20, 1883, the first Women's Club of Florida was formed by 25 ladies and came to be known as the Village Improvement Association of Green Cove Springs. Mrs. A. M. Rutledge was President.

A festival ball was held to raise money to clean up the town. It was here possibly where the barrel idea came from. We were concerned with Environment then and today one of our CSPs is Environment still!



Check out the poem from the top of the barrel:

To make our town attractive and neat I stand ever ready to aid you: Throw in the trash that's under your feet And I will kindly thank you.

VIA Barrel, Circa 1888

Back to the ball, \$12 was raised to make the town look better and making boardwalks. In addition, 70 feet of clay pavement was laid. Women were tired before this of walking in dirt and other unmentionable things! They got their beautiful high top shoes very dirty and they did not like that.
