


VIA Partners with Augusta Savage



April Meeting Recap



Wasn't our April meeting powerful? I have heard from so many of you that our April meeting was likely the best ever! A lot of time and effort was poured into making it a great event, and it came together beautifully! The theme was so powerful, the speakers were excellent, and the decorations were beautiful! Most of all, everyone was there for a common goal of service to the community.

Our first speaker was Tara Green, the Clerk of Court from the Clay County courthouse. Her most prominent message was that the courthouse was often the first place where signs of Human Trafficking can be spotted. She did an excellent job covering this topic and then she introduced the speaker, Carol Gardner, whose daughter had been a victim of Human Trafficking. Her story was very impactful, as well as enlightening.

Sherin Brennick, from Villages of Hope was our main speaker. She was able to share about the project of tiny homes for victims of Human Trafficking. Her speech was followed by that of Michelle Cook, sheriff of Clay County and then a speaker from her department that did undercover work to rescue victims and locate perpetrators. This succession of speakers was followed by a thorough "question and answer" period. So many sincere and thoughtful questions were answered so thoroughly by a variety of speakers.

The program was concluded by Jackie Krug from Quigley House, who did an awesome job sharing about domestic violence and how it connects to Human Trafficking, and how their services intertwine. Our Theresa Crockett shared the connection between the program and the District 4 Women's Club and how it was our Director, Terry Laws' signature program for her term.

This was very impactful for all involved. Much awareness was brought to our community and our members. A special thank you to Janey Fox and Debbie Holmes for coordinating such a meaningful meeting and event.

GFWC Massachusetts first President, Julia Ward Howe and the connection to Mother's Day.

As we celebrate Mother's Day, it's important to remember its history.

"Too few Americans are aware that early advocates of Mother's Day in the United States originally envisioned it as a day of peace, to honor and support mothers who lost sons and husbands to the carnage of the Civil War.

In 1870 — nearly 40 years before it became an official U.S. holiday in 1914 — social justice advocate Julia Ward Howe issued her inspired Mother's Day Proclamation, which called upon mothers of all nationalities to band together to promote the "amicable settlement of international questions, the great and general interests of peace." She envisioned a day of solemn council where women from all over the world could meet to discuss the means whereby to achieve world peace. In the spirit of Julia Ward Howe's original call, this occasion can be a time to dedicate ourselves, on behalf of mothers, fathers, sisters and brothers everywhere, to rise up and protect our most vulnerable by calling for our leaders to make a directional shift in the course of our nation. There is no need more urgent than addressing the devastation brought on by violence in all of its forms - affecting the lives of untold millions in our nation and around the world. Then, we may finally see the carnage and devastation of violence and war fade into its own history. There could of course be no better way to honor our mothers."

"The House That Built {Us}"



On April 24, we had a "Venue Expo" to showcase our beautiful historic building and show the community the variety of events and celebrations that our clubhouse can host. We had a variety of decorations on each table, including weddings, birthdays, baby showers, and graduation receptions. One of the most notable things about promoting this event was how many members of our surrounding areas had memories of events that had been held in our clubhouse. Citizens commented about having had a baby shower there, been to a family member's wedding there, and attending many anniversary celebrations in our clubhouse.

The ongoing theme in all the conversations was the memories created in our clubhouse. People love the historical atmosphere and the heritage that has been maintained in our building. They also love knowing that our building was "home" to a lot of Green Cove's prominent events and celebrations. Most also comment about how well-preserved things are, and how proud our members are of the history. We need to work hard to keep that reputation and promote our building for all these reasons. Remember, our clubhouse is at the core of what we are able to do, and the rentals are our most lucrative source of income.

History Corner

Who are these women?

Who are the women whose portraits hang in our clubhouse? The large one nearest the podium is that of Mrs. E.G.G. Munsell. Ms. Munsell came to Green Cove Springs in 1887 from New York City. She and Miss Penelope Borden revived the ladies club, which had become somewhat dormant from late September, 1884 until the first of the year in 1888. These two ladies enlisted the help of their husbands to clean and restore the cemeteries of Green Cove Springs. They even gave honorary membership to the men that assisted with the clean-up project.

Penelope Borden is responsible for the land and the building that we still meet in today. Her family is that of "Borden Milk Company" and her name is listed in the latest version of VIA minutes. The chandelier in our foyer, donated to us by Elizabeth Van Rensburg, D4 director from 2022-2024, is affectionately named "Penelope" in honor of Mrs. Borden.
