

"The House That Built {Us}"



Our clubhouse has definitely stepped out of its "comfort zone" these past few months. Our vendor expo followed by our Friday night line dancing showed just how flexible our historic building can be! Some of our D4 awards, as well, were based on its flexibility and different styles of decorating! The vendor expo, the Art Walk, and the book sale were all done beautifully and appropriately in three days' time.

We are "stepping out of our comfort zone" with rentals as well. Right now, venue rentals are not as plentiful as they have been in the past, but we are getting rentals for shorter periods of time on a more regularly scheduled basis. We are still bringing in much needed funds and being supportive of our community and other organizations. It may be a bit less convenient at times, but we need to earn money for some of our much-needed repairs. Remember, too, that the more exposure our clubhouse gets, the better it is for our club. More and more we are presenting ourselves as a vital part of this community. History Corner

Check this out

Have an established meeting place has always vital to our club. Having a visual presence helps to ensure the community sees the important role the VIA plays in the Green Cove Springs. Before the clubhouse we use today was built, the VIA met in the home of Mrs. John C. Borden. Called "Village Cottage", this home was built in 1880 by John C. Borden, so of the inventor of condensed milk.

When you can, check out the original VIA Clubhouse located at 503 Magnolia Avenue in Green Cove Springs. The tower on the right was used for judging the house races which occurred on Magnolia Avenue. Later, the house was used as the first home of the VIA. The building of the clubhouse we use today was spearheaded in 1914 by Penelopey Borden Hamilton. The building was dedicated by May Mann Jennings, who was President of the Florida Federation of Women's Club.
